On Sunday, June 2, 2019, the Mission Society Board sponsored the annual Mission Awareness Dinner at Hope Moravian Church. Pastor David Merritt and a group of willing workers from Hope Moravian helped Society Board Members cook and serve an authentic Cuban feast for the souls and bodies of approximately 120 folks who were present to enjoy the meal.

The evening was spent being inspired by Brother Joe Jarvis of the Armando Rusindo Mission Foundation with his report of the most recent trip to Cuba. The work that is going on in our sister churches in Cuba is moving rapidly to help our brothers and sisters in those communities become more self-sustaining as they spread the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Ministry with and to children in those churches is just exploding with kids and their families being led to the Lord.

As an additional treat for the evening, the Rt. Rev. Armand Rusindo, the first native-born Cuban Bishop of the Moravian Church was able to travel from Cuba to be with us! Bishop Rusindo further inspired us by sharing some of the Cuban church's struggles, as well as the exciting and growing ministry in which they are engaged.

LUMBERTON HOUSE BUILD PROGRESSING

The Yadkin View Regional Conference of Churches (RCC) teamed up with the United Methodist Church and adopted a house in Lumberton, NC for a rebuild of a home for a gentleman who lost his home as a result of Hurricanes Matthew and Florence. The RCC sees this project as a wonderful opportunity to use our skills, meet and work with people from other congregations, and offer support and service to this gentleman.

On Saturday, a team from Clemmons Moravian brought chain saws. Large trees had been cut on the property and just left. The team went to the work site and cut up the trees for the homeowner.

Our RCC churches are: Clemmons, New Philadelphia, Macedonia, New Hope, and Unity. On June 12th, Pastor Chris Thore of Clemmons drove the Moravian Disaster Relief Trailer to Lumberton where he was met by a team of volunteers from Macedonia led by Pastor Zach Dease. With the foundation already poured and the floor joists in place, the Macedonia team installed the subflooring. The Macedonia team spent the night at Chestnut Street Methodist Church which provides temporary housing for volunteers. The next day Macedonia was joined by two



Teams from Macedonia and Clemmons were able to complete the framing the following week. With the framing now complete, the roof trusses are scheduled to be placed on June 28 with the help of volunteers from Clemmons. Our goal is to have the house under roof by mid July with additional teams going to complete the house.

You might ask how can I help? Many jobs and hands are needed. Carpenters, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC

volunteers are some of the skilled workers needed. Other jobs are getting supplies from Lowe's or the warehouse, running errands, picking up lunches for the volunteers, tossing cold water bottles to the workers, picking up trash, painters, and cutting trees.

2019 MORAVIAN WOMEN'S CONFERENCE

June 2019 marked the 13th Moravian Women's Conference and the 48th year since the first conference. Certainly, conferences are a tradition but more importantly, they are a movement! Sisters form vibrant relationships that connect them and ministries across churches, provinces, and the world. Sisters were inspired as individuals to know and to live God's plan for them. Sisters departed the conferences equipped for Living the Essentials.

The 2019 conference theme was "Unleash Your Power!" based on Ephesians 3:20, "Glory to God, who is able to do far beyond all we could ask or imagine by his power at work within us." The conference committee prayerfully sought guidance for a theme that speaks to the potential and strength of Moravian women in 2019. The Ephesians passage almost leapt onto the table after a day and a half of discernment. Past conference attendees experienced great Joy on the Mountain in 2007, bravely committed to Stepping Out of the Boat in 2011 and learned what it means to Walk in the Light in 2015.

Our Keynote Speakers were:

- * Sarah Bessey—from British Columbia, Canada, author of "Jesus Feminist" and other encouraging books.
- * The Rt. Rev. Kay Ward—retired from Moravian Theological Seminary, author, and Bishop of the Worldwide Unity.
- * The Rev. Christie Melby-Gibbons—Ex. Dir. of Tricklebee Café, artist, ordained Moravian minister.
- * The Rev. Dr. Heather Hartung Vacek—Vice President and Dean of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, author of "Madness: American Protestant Responses to Mental Illness," ordained Moravian minister.
- * Dena Grillo Fortuzi—born in Tirana, Albania, church leader in the Moravian Church, Albania, published 5 books of poetry and short prose.



In 2019, we discovered together how to seek and know God's plans for each of us, how to be his face in the world today; and how to unleash our power by accessing his power at work within us. The 2019 Moravian Women's Conference was held at the Embassy Suites Twin City Quarter in Winston-Salem, N.C. The vibrancy of downtown Winston-Salem and the city's Moravian legacy provide an ideal setting for a dynamic conference for Moravian women.

Over 430 women from throughout The Unity attended the conference with 95 sisters outside the North American provinces joining their sisters for this 13th conference. On Saturday evening at the closing lovefeast at Home Moravian Church, an offering was received in support of women's work in Cuba. The funds will be administered by the Armando Rusindo Mission Foundation.
