I had never heard of The Cheesecake Factory before and had it not been for this situation where a family member had to go there to figure out how to navigate in a wheel chair I maybe never would have gone there.

It was a situation that I was not immediately thankful or grateful for. Today I am very grateful that I discovered The Cheesecake Factory. Sometimes those events in life that don't seem to be so lovely and wonderful, can be very meaningful when we have a chance to look back on them and realize what has grown out of that experience.

This is the month of Thanksgiving. I encourage you to be thankful every day, not just on Thursday in November. I especially encourage you to look back on past experiences that may not have been so joyful but that you can now in the rear view mirror be thankful for.
