First Moravian Church of Uhrichsville, OH



Ladles of Love

The mission of First Moravian Church of Uhrichsville is serving Christ, Community and Congregation. After an after-school program was completed, members Linda Spring and Jeanne Carrothers sat down to see what could be done with the money they had left from the program. From this, in February 2019 the Ladles of Love program began providing free healthy and hearty meals to those with various needs in their community. Since opening their doors and hearts, on Tuesday nights twice a month, they have grown from serving 50 meals to approximately 185 meals to local people. This has been a muchneeded service since Covid-19 had an economic impact in the rural Dennison-Uhrichsville area. If people cannot pick up their meal, a group of volunteers deliver them. They deliver to residents of Buckeye House, a low-income apartment complex, shut-ins and people in ill health, and also to second shift workers at the local hospital in appreciation of their commitment to the community.

Meals can vary from meatloaf, sloppy joes, chicken pot pies to many other delicious main dishes and always include a side, vegetable, roll and dessert. The majority of the congregation



volunteer in some capacity as well as members of the John Heckewelder Moravian Church and Fry's Valley Moravian Church and friends and

family.

All their financing comes from grants and donations. They have received some local grants as well as grants from the Larger Life Foundation. In 2023, they received \$9236.50 in grants and donations. The average cost per meal is \$1.55.

Matthew 25:35 says "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink. The First Moravian Church of Uhrichsville lives out this verse twice a month with their program and many people are thankful for their commitment.

This month's Mission Minute comes from the Rev. Sue Koenig, who serves on the Board of World Mission's board of directors. She is the Moravian Church Northern Province's Director of Racial Justice and Healing. One of the ways the Board of World Mission is participating in the commitment to racial justice and healing is through its Mission Grant program. The goal of this program is "to walk with our partners as they disciple people in knowing and living out Christ in their lives; and promote sustainability within their church." Our global partners propose projects of their own determination that will benefit their communities, and complete a grant application process requesting funding to implement the project. If the grant is awarded, the BWM Outreach Committee subsequently meets with our partners to hear the inspiring stories of the impact these projects are having in the daily lives of individuals and communities. One example is a bakery in the Honduras Mission Province that was recently funded through a mission grant and is operated by a group of local women; this project provides food, employment, and economic stability in the village of Ahuas.

The Mission Grant program is grounded in the creation of just and equitable partnerships for mission and service and represents a step towards racial justice and healing, and the creation of God's beloved community.

For the past several years, our church has been reckoning with its heart-wrenching history of racism, slavery, colonialism, and segregation; a history we are learning through the recent research of Rev. Dr. Frank Crouch. In response, the church has committed to whole-heartedly seeking authentic ways of repentance and healing and working to build just and equitable relationships. A new liturgy for this year's Black History Month represents part of this process.
