# Why We Should Not Sing Together Now

Based on multiple scientific sources from medical schools and universities

1. COVID-19 spreads by aerosols. These are the tiny droplets, too small to see, that carry virus particles. They can travel through air for far more than 6 feet, and linger in air for several minutes. Speaking loudly, laughing, and singing produce large quantities of aerosols – think how far you can smell garlic on someone’s breath when they’ve laughed several feet away. And when you are singing with someone else, you are also taking in deeper breaths – with a high probability of ingesting the aerosols they are exuding.

2. COVID-19 can be active in the body, and transmitted by someone, who has no symptoms at all. And the existing tests still show too high a percentage of “false negatives” – negative results from a test of someone who does actually carry the virus. That means, first, that you might actually have COVID-19 and not know it; and you can give it to other people without their knowing it. Again, this is not like the flu or a cold; we’re vividly aware when someone singing near us has a cold or the flu!

3. Because of these two factors – aerosol transmission and asymptomatic transmission – there have been numerous instances of singing together in rehearsals or performance becoming “supertransmitters” – one asymptomatic carrier can infect many people, with tragic results.

4. Even if it doesn’t kill you, the new coronavirus can be devastating to your life for a long time. Recent research is showing a large number of people who have seemingly mild cases, and don’t need to be hospitalized, but suffer ongoing symptoms for months afterwards. Unlike the flu, one doesn’t recover from COVID-19 in two weeks or so. Moreover, scientists still don’t know the long-term effects on the health of the heart and lungs and other organs. Unnecessary risks should not be taken.

5. COVID-19 doesn’t care if you’re best friends or family members. It doesn’t know that. There is no “family dispensation”. *If you are not actively quarantining with someone, you should not be “hanging out” with them without maintaining physical distancing and wearing a mask.*

6. If one must sing, these are ways to make it less risky (not without risk).

a. Wear a mask. Yes, it’s uncomfortable; but you can sing in a mask. This helps keep you from spreading your aerosols to someone else.

b. Keep your distance. Stay at least 12-15 feet apart from anyone else. That includes accompanist, pastor, fellow singer, congregation – everyone.

c. If you are outside, make sure no one is downwind from you. If you are inside, make sure the air conditioning isn’t blowing.

7. The best counsel is this:

Consider your not singing as your gift to God and your sacrifice of love for your brothers and sisters.

## ***PEC News for August***

Using video conferencing, the PEC held regular meetings Aug. 13 and 27 with all members participating. These meetings included sharing news from across the Province and intercessory prayer for pastors, church educators, and congregations. PEC also joined the afternoon Pastor to Pastor conversation both days.

### **SYNOD / STRATEGIC DIRECTION**

PEC received a report from the Synod Planning Committee, including: a calendar of key dates in preparing for Synod, a draft of a Synod delegate covenant, an update on securing a venue; and possible co-chairs for Synod. PEC determined that, due to COVID-19, there will not be an Intersynodal Conference in 2021. PEC reviewed action items from 2018 Synod Resolution 19 (Continuing the Journey of Reconciliation). PEC received a letter from the Laurel Ridge Board Executive Committee about plans for the 60th anniversary capital campaign, and referred the letter to the Provincial Support Services Board.

### **CHURCHES AND LEADERS**

PEC discussed and developed a memo for church boards about annual church councils in 2020. PEC continued appropriate steps in call processes for: Ardmore, Bethania, Fairview, Little Church on the Lane, and Rural Hall; and made plans for introductory conversations with the church boards at First, Greensboro and Hope. PEC received a report from the Commission on Ministry and approved Reed Lawson as a candidate for ordination. The Aug. 13 meeting included conversation with six approved candidates: Adriana Craver, Scott Rainey, Margaret Norris, Josh Follweiler, Noah Smith and Madi White. Aug 27, PEC met with a prospective candidate for ordination. PEC renewed the appointment of Safiatu Braima as Provincial Acolyte serving the Sierra Leone Unity Mission Area; revised the guidelines for Congregational Acolytes about their assisting a pastor in the distribution of Communion; and discussed particular needs and situations of three pastors. PEC began preparing answers to questions from a survey conducted by the Moravian Ministry Association in advance of their Sept. 3 meeting.

### **BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS**

PEC approved a request from the Moravian Team for Reconciliation to expand its membership; and discussed advice and guidance to Provincial boards and agencies in the preparation of 2021 budgets. PEC received a letter from the Laurel Ridge Board executive committee

### **INTERPROVINCIAL, UNITY and ECUMENICAL**

In the Aug 13 meeting PEC met for one hour via video conferencing with the Northern Province PEC to share how both Provinces are dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic, and other topics. PEC received a brief report about the Aug. 10-11 meetings of the Steering Committee for Christian Churches Together in the USA. PEC received a letter announcing the World Council of Churches Assembly will be moved to 2022. PEC noted that the partnership agreement has been signed with the NC Synod ELCA for The Dwelling, an emerging ministry in downtown Winston-Salem.

**OTHER MATTERS**

PEC noted the receipt of a contribution of \$5,800 from a retired pastor which has been placed in the Pastoral Assistance Fund; received a status update about the re-opening plans for day care and preschool ministries at fourteen churches; and agreed to produce a brief, video message for congregations and the membership.

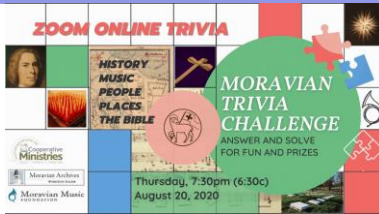
