## **Announcement from the Provincial Elders' Conference**

*We give thanks for The Rev. David Guthrie's 11+ years of service as  
PEC President*



The Provincial Elders' Conference (PEC) reports to the province that it has approved a retirement request from President David Guthrie, effective Sept. 30, 2021. It also announces that continuing PEC members have appointed The Rev. Chris Thore to fill the vacancy on the Conference as well as to become its new president, effective Oct. 1, 2021. With the approval of his boards, Chris will continue as pastor of Clemmons Moravian Church while serving the province. He will serve as PEC president through transition after provincial elections at the next Synod, which convenes June 1, 2022.

## *We welcome The Rev. Chris Thore as our new PEC President*

Chris returns to the PEC after serving two terms from 2010 – 2018, when he was vice president. After a management career in music, Chris earned a Master of Divinity from Gordon-Conwell University and a certificate in theology from Moravian Seminary. Ordained in 1998, Chris's first call was to Trinity Moravian Church. In 2001, he accepted a call to become the founding pastor of a new church plant in Huntersville, N.C., New Beginnings Moravian Church. Consecrated as a Presbyterian in 2004, Chris led the growth of the congregation and expansion of facilities at New Beginnings until called to Clemmons Moravian in March 2018.

On behalf of the Province, the PEC extends great gratitude to David for his 11 years' service as president and his dedicated service to the Moravian Church. David left a construction career to pursue ministry in 1983. A 1986 graduate of Moravian Theological Seminary, he was ordained that year and consecrated as a Presbyterian in 1991. After graduation, David accepted a call to Prince of Peace Moravian Church and later Rolling Hills Moravian Church, both in Florida, where he served until 2003. He returned to Winston-Salem to serve as executive director of the Board of Evangelism and Home Missions for seven years before being elected PEC president in 2010. In 2018, David was elected vice president of the Unity Board of the Worldwide Moravian Church and in January 2020 he became its president. He has also served on the Moravian Seminary Board of Trustees as well as in numerous ecumenical positions on behalf of the Moravian Church.



The Provincial Elders' Conference invites your prayers for Chris and his family as he assumes leadership of our Province and for David and his family as he steps into well-deserved rest.

## **PEC News October 2021**

### **PEC News October 2021 Provincial Ties**

The Provincial Elders' Conference met September 9 and 23. Nola Knouse and David Guthrie were away Sept. 9. All members participated September 23. Incoming President, Chris Thore, joined both meetings. News and needs from across the Province were shared, with time set aside for intercessory prayer.

### **SYNOD / STRATEGIC DIRECTION**

PEC received an update from the Provincial Organization Core Team (2018 Resolutions 17 and 18), and made plans to meet with the Team to answer questions; received updates from the Synod Planning Committee, approved the Synod Committee structure and descriptions; and determined that the February 2022 Synod Delegate Gathering would take place via video conferencing rather than in-person.

### **CHURCHES AND LEADERS**

PEC confirmed arrangements for the ordination of Scott Rainey, Reed Lawson and Adriana Craver, and details for Angelica Reglado to continue serving at Estamo Unidos, and also as Director of Mission Outreach with the Board of World Mission; granted permission for one pastor to pursue placement opportunities with the NC

Synod of the ELCA; and received a report from Fran Saylor on explorations for a new effort, known as “the Table,” in the Triangle region of NC. PEC took appropriate steps in call processes for: Ardmore, Bethabara, First Greensboro, Hope, Hopewell, and Union Cross; discussed needs for interim pastors for Hope, Hopewell, Leaksville and Union Cross; approved changes in the Rules and Regulations for the Konnoak Hills congregation; and discussed a request from one congregation wanting to sell their parsonage. PEC received an update from the Commission on Ministry on the status and progress of five approved candidates for ordination; and made assignments for PEC participation in upcoming services of ordination and installation in October. Due to schedules and pandemic restrictions, PEC decided not to have a ‘PEC night’ at the Moravian Ministry Association retreat, but to offer a conversation time at a regular MMA meeting in the future.

### **BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS**

PEC met with Rebecca Craver, Director of Congregational Development for an update on the beginning of her ministry and plans to form the Commission on Congregational Development; approved a request from Sunnyside Ministry to distribute a bulletin insert to congregations in November; and appointed, at the Board’s request Joan Burri (Raleigh) and Evette Campbell (Rolling Hills) to four year terms on the Board of Trustees of the Moravian Music Foundation. PEC received a report from the Archives Commission about a part-time archives staff person, and progress in the search for a professional archivist.

### **INTERPROVINCIAL, UNITY and ECUMENICAL**

PEC received news that the Northern Province has decided to postpone its 2022 Synod, with current PEC members extending their terms by one year; and confirmed plans for an abbreviated annual joint meeting of the PECs to be conducted online in early December. Guthrie provided a brief report of the Sept. 8-9 meeting of the Unity Executive Committee, in Switzerland, as well as an update from Christian Churches Together in the USA.

### **OTHER MATTERS**

PEC approved Dave Marcus, Assistant to the President, pursuing membership in and certification by the Society of Human Resource Managers; and discussed the annual operating budgets of the PEC and the HR Office for 2022. PEC reviewed an edited and expanded video presentation about the Moravian understanding of scripture, which will be commended to congregations for their use. PEC discussed the Oct. 1 beginning of Chris Thore’s service as PEC President, with David Guthrie working two days per week until Thanksgiving to support this leadership transition.

PEC will meet October 7 and 21.

Brother **Jeffrey Reed Lawson**, an approved candidate for ordination, has accepted a call to become pastor of Christ Moravian Church, Winston-Salem, NC. A service of ordination will be held on October 3, 2021 at Bethania Moravian Church, Bethania, NC at 3 p.m. with Bishop Graham Rights officiating. Reed will begin his service at Christ Moravian on Sunday, October 10, 2021.

## *Board of World Mission Announcement*

The Board of World Mission is pleased to announce that the Rev. **Angelica Regalado Cieza** will be joining our staff as the Director of Mission Outreach. Angelica lives with her husband Ruben and their two daughters in Winston-Salem, NC. Angelica graduated from Wake Forest University School of Divinity with her Masters in Divinity and obtained her certificate of Moravian Studies from the Moravian Theological Seminary.
