2023 Watchword

The watchword for the Southern Province is Nehemiah 9:31 – “Lord, in your great mercies you did not make an end of your people.”

“Interdependence – the Challenge of Working Together” Part 2

One key expression for development and the practice of successful leadership for our Moravian forebears is “interdependence.” It has been woven deeply into the fabric of Moravian history from the development of the choir system to how settlement communities (i.e., Bethlehem and Salem) were supposed to function. It continues to be a core value for healthy congregational leadership and ministry. But in reality working interdependently with a group of people – or with a network of groups – is not our natural tendency. Most folks in our broader society prefer independence or dependence. Doing things our own way or demanding a set way for others to follow is much easier than the effort and investment it takes to develop mutual trust that is interdependent.

Last month, I mentioned a book, The Power of Giving Power Away (Matthew Barzun, 2021). It explains this phenomenon. The storyline of Rudyard Kipling's The Jungle Book may be a more familiar example. It features the stories of Mowgli, who was orphaned at a young age, is raised by animals in the jungle, and learns through adventure and challenge. He starts out dependent on others for his care. As he grows older, he assumes that being fiercely independent is the source of strength and power. But he discovers that living the jungle life is a constant pendulum swing between trying to be independent and winding up dependent on others for safety and care. When he returns to live in the village, his final lesson toward development is the challenge of engaging mutual interdependence with others. Mowgli discovers this struggle is its own jungle.

A key aspect that drives our preferences related to independence or dependence versus interdependence is how we feel and think about uncertainty. Matthew Barzun contends that we opt for independence (or dependence in some cases) because we are generally uncomfortable with uncertainty. Being independent or dependent, lets us create who is "us" and who is "them." These positions give us easier responses to being anxious and uncertain and even provide the illusion of certainty and control in our attempt to create predictable outcomes and measures.

Interdependence is hard because it requires the investment of relationships. Not just the simple surface connections of knowing who to call when you need something fixed, but the deeper level of actively seeking to show up for one another and share true interest in one another's wellbeing and success. For interdependence to be successful, it requires a willingness to make room for being uncomfortable at times. To resist our nature for certainty and predictability. And to trust the process that brings us into closer cooperation and relationship with one another. It opens a new awareness of what it means to be "us together" – rather than "us" versus "them."

The PEC has asked all clergy, provincial acolytes, and Christian educators under call or appointment in the congregations and ministries of the Southern Province to gather for an important summit – February 23 and 24 at New Philadelphia Moravian Church. This includes those in specialized ministry who are eligible for call.

There are three goals for this event: 1) to share important updates for the work the 2022 Synod asked of all of us; 2) to offer a process for building together a clear vision and direction for our mutual ministry; 3) to provide space for the PEC to listen and gather feedback about building stronger relationships of mutual trust.

The event begins at 5 PM, Thursday, February 23 at New Philadelphia Moravian Church – with an opening and dinner, followed by a presentation from the PEC. Beginning at 8:30 AM, Friday, February 24 (until 5 PM) various members of the PEC will provide presentations on the theme of TRUST, each with a period of small group discussion and total group feedback. The PEC is covering the cost for travel for those traveling in from a distance, including lodging on Thursday and Friday nights for those who need it. If this includes you, please share your request for lodging and travel plans with Beverly Johnson no later than **February 7**. All attending the event need to RSVP to Beverly by this same date (bjohnson@mcsp.org).

Please join me and the PEC as we work through this summit to take important steps toward a shared vision of interdependence and cooperation – and listening for the leading of God's Spirit.

This year, 2023, the Unity Prayer Day Offering will go to kickstart the fundraising for the Moravian Unity Disaster Relief Fund (MUDRF). This project will assist Moravian provinces seeking support for disaster relief in the event of natural or manmade disasters occurring in the area of operation of the Moravian Provinces.

After gathering contributions, congregations may send one check to the Provincial Finance Office clearly indicating that it is for the Unity Offering.

News from the PEC

February 2023

The PEC met on January 5 and 19. Our present work has included approving the financial audit of the provincial finances, conducting call meetings with three congregations, and planning the upcoming Leadership Summit (Feb 23 & 24 at New Philadelphia Moravian Church). Visiting congregations as part of worship included visits to Calvary, The Table, Clemmons, and Union Cross. Plans are underway for additional visits as part of Wednesday night Lenten programs at Mizpah and Rural Hall.

The Rt. Rev. Lane Sapp completed his ministry at Calvary with a send off on January 8. He arrived and began as the Director of the Commission on Ministry on January 30.

Development is underway in partnership with the Provincial Support Services Board to bring together a property committee to assist in assessing the needs and responsibilities connected to acquiring or closing church property. This is particularly necessary at present with the close of Providence Moravian Church (December 31, 2022) that includes ongoing maintenance and operation of its cemetery.

Call process conversations continue with Ardmore, Grace, Kernersville, Leaksville, Moravia and Raleigh. Conversation has begun to secure more clarification for helping fellowships and congregations in development – including The Table and Come and Worship.

The PEC hosted the Moravian Ministries Association meeting on January 5, 10:30 AM at Trinity Moravian. We featured what we are learning from Quadrennial Review conversations with clergy and congregations. Part of the meeting included ways clergy and DCEs can work together for crowd sourcing ideas and goals for the new year. A principle theme being: what does it mean to engage successful ministry in the aftermath of the pandemic. The meeting on Feb 2 will focus on what the PEC is discovering about the call process including space for feedback from the clergy and DCEs. Please remember that attendance at MMA meetings is expected from all clergy, provincial acolytes, and DCEs under call or appointment to congregations in the MCSP. A virtual link is available for those unable to be in-person. However, in-person attendance is greatly encouraged.

The PEC meetings for February have been moved to accommodate the schedule of various engagements and the Leadership Summit. They include Feb 9 and Feb 25.


